Sub: Marine Fishing Ban Period 2021

Madam,

Greetings from Dakshinbanga Matsyajibi Forum (DMF).

The Department of Fisheries in the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying of the Government of India has, under their G.O. No.30035/15/97-Fy (T-1) Vol.V dt. 30.03.2021 (copy enclosed) has imposed uniform ban on fishing by all fishing vessels in the Indian EEZ beyond territorial waters for 61 days on both the East and West Coasts as in the following –

East Coast: 15<sup>th</sup> April to 14<sup>th</sup> June 2021; West Coast: 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2021.

The traditional non-motorised boats are exempted from the ban beyond territorial waters.

We are given to understand from past practice that the Department of Fisheries of the Government of West Bengal will be issuing a matching fishing ban order in the territorial waters of West Bengal. DMF is putting up the following demands regarding the fishing ban for your immediate consideration –

- It is of utmost regret that the Government of West Bengal in the Department of Fisheries is not implementing the 'Savings-cum-Relief Scheme' since 2015. The scheme was specifically meant for providing livelihood support to fish workers affected by the fishing ban. The 'Savings-cum-Relief Scheme' should be restarted forthwith.
- 2. Each and every fish worker affected by the fishing ban should be provided with a livelihood support of Rs. 5,000/- per month during the fishing ban period.

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- 3. DMF maintains that 61 days' ban is not enough for regeneration of natural fish stock. The ban period should be increased to at least 90 days.
- 4. Since the mechanized fishing boats are much more damaging to the ecosystem than the small scale fishing boats and since they take more than 80% of the catch and are primarily responsible for overfishing in near shore areas, the fishing ban should be imposed applying the principle of scale subsidiarity as in the following
  - i. 90 days ban on fishing for all motorized boats with livelihood compensation/support for affected fish workers.
  - ii. 120 days ban for all mechanized fishing boats.

## **ORDER**

The President of India is pleased to impose a uniform ban on fishing by all fishing vessels in the Indian Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) beyond territorial waters on the East Coast [including West Bengal, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Puducherry, Tamil Nadu, Andaman, & Nicobar Islands] and West Coast [including Gujarat, Daman & Diu, Karnataka, Goa, Maharashtra, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and Lakshadweep Islands] as per period mentioned below for conservation and effective management of fishery resources and also for sea safety reasons:

East Coast-from 15<sup>th</sup> April to 14<sup>th</sup> June 2021 (both days inclusive) (61 days) West Coast-from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> July 2021 (both days inclusive) (61 days)

The traditional non-motorized units shall be exempted from this uniform fishing ban imposed in the Indian EEZ beyond territorial waters.

This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.
